—Isaiah 35.6

The Urgency of Easter

There was urgency to the first Easter day. They were thinking of it already on the day Christ died.

The women who had come with him from Galilee followed and saw the tomb and how his body was laid. ⁵⁶ Then they returned and prepared spices and ointments. Then: On the Sabbath they rested according to the commandment. (Lk 23:55-56)

But already they were thinking about reaching the Lord Jesus, to anoint His body after His death. So Mark records in chapter 16: When the Sabbath was past, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices...² And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. ³ And they were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" (Mark 16:1-3 ESV)

Who indeed. The disciples were all in hiding. The Jews had insisted on a guard being placed at the tomb. But they were urgent to get to the body of Jesus before the corruption of decomposition would set in.

Yet it had said, Psalm 16:10: *You will* not let your holy one see decay. Those words of promise and the words of Jesus Himself were all forgotten, obscured by the realities of Good Friday.

ELS West Coast Pastoral Conference—April 30 & May 1 Thank you to all at Redeemer for hosting the event! The women expected to find Jesus cold and lifeless, to embalm His body in one last act of devotion, and then leave. Then all the urgency would be over. Everything would be over.

Instead what they found was the stone already rolled away. What they found was the graveclothes left behind, and the guard that had been posted had fled in fear because of the angels sent from heaven. What they found was good news and a whole new and unexpected urgency: Go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. (Matthew 28:7 ESV)

Had they found Him still in death, there would be nothing left to do or say. With Him Risen and Living, the joy and the good work and the Easter proclamation goes on. In that joy of the Easter morning, we take our steps to organize ourselves. We take stock of our gifts to use them in service of the Risen Christ. We make our plans to seek Him while He may be found. And come Sunday, women who are devoted to Him still perform their service of love for Him, preparing the Host that in the Holy Communion is His Body.
