The Dry Season

The Church Year (which begins in Advent, most often on the first Sunday in December) breaks out in two halves. The first half is commonly referred to as the *Time of Christ*.

The Time of Christ has the penitential seasons of Advent and Lent. The time of Christ has the high points of the year. It has the three High Festivals of Christmas, Easter and Pentecost—commemorating the Birth of Jesus, the Resurrection of our Crucified Savior from the grave, and the fulfilling of His promise to send the Holy Spirit to guide His church.

Then it gets to—what is for us—the dry season, so to speak. It gets hot. Snow birds all return home. Some of our members also seek some refuge in travel and cooler places farther north.

That's how we begin the *Time of the Church*. The Time of the Church begins with Trinity Sunday (June 15th this year) and goes until the last Sunday in the church year (which takes us to the second to last or last Sunday in November.)

We are about to turn that corner once again. We are making the transition from the Time of Christ to the Time of the Church. We go seeking refuge from the heat. We are also entering a time in the life of the Church where the Chrisitan life comes more into focus.

It's not a clean break. It cannot be. Everything we have learned and heard and seen carries over and carries through for us. We need it to.

The Christian life, you see, is a life of mortal dependence and need. It is a life that centers in the answer to our needs, found only in Jesus. The Time of the Church is a time that grows out of the promises made by Jesus and kept in Jesus. It depends on His perfect and ongoing faithfuless to those promises:

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth... You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you. I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. (John 14:16-18 ESV)

Though we are sinners, quite given to drifting away, the Time of the Church is not a time for wandering from God's Word and Promises. The Time of the Church is our time of living in the Father's mercy for Jesus' sake. It is our time for the Spirit of truth to dwell with and guide us. It is our time to cling to our Lord Jesus when and where we find Him, in His Word and Sacrament, as He keeps the promise He makes to us: I will come to you.
