The Congregation Prays: A Devotional Guide In Sunday's Bulletin! A Wild Hair on a Hot Afternoon

-Isaiah 35.6

I pulled into our household driveway on a recent afternoon and noticed the massive flowering bush in the middle of the front yard. It was huge and starting to look out of control—threatening to take over the tree growing in the midst of it, and the little cacti growing around it.

I had noticed this before—but other things got in the way. Today, I thought, I was going to do something about it. I found the hedge trimmer and the extension cord and got a big cup of water to stay hydrated. I set to work. Perhaps Providence provided a little warning for me when I accidentally cut through the power cord with the hedge trimmer. Undaunted, I bought another from the Home Depot and soldiered on, happily sending boughs flying and kicking up dust, sawing through the tiny hose for the water line at least a time or two...

Only afterward did it dawn on me (actually someone else pointed out) the danger: *I hope that the hedge survives*. That's when I finally said to myself:

Maybe you shouldn't cut it back that much. Maybe you shouldn't cut it back that much RIGHT NOW—when the heat is so severe. Maybe there's an art to this, and maybe it's worth the effort to learn it so that you don't finally kill everything that's still growing in your Arizona front yard. This wasn't the best time to cut that back.

I guess I'm learning this as a spiritual lesson, too: misplaced zeal can be just as damaging as apathy and neglect.

This calls for prayer, and guidance from our Lord. This calls for wisdom and watchfulness, and an open ear.

Let's pray for our yard, so to speak. Let's pray for wisdom, and compassion for those who maybe suffer in the heat. Let's ask the Lord to help us to know when and how to invite and to encourage, without causing any harm. Let's ask the Lord to deliver us from our worldliness and carelessness, since our Lord has taught us using plants and a coming harvest to know our times:

Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. ³⁶ Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. (John 4:35-36 ESV)

God grant you *the Joy* of hearing His voice in the forgiveness of all your sins—misplaced zeal, neglect, and all of them! God grant you *the Joy*, also, of seeing the fruits of the same mercy being gathered in for eternal life.
