The Congregation Prays: A Devotional Guide In Sunday's Bulletin!

Sprachgefühl

Toward the end of the summer I finally opened a gift that I have had waiting for me since Christmas. I had wanted to brush up on language skills, and my wife Heather got me a lifetime membership with Rosetta Stone. I couldn't be more delighted!

Luther writes in German. So I started there. I had studied German before, but I was surprised to find how quickly it got rusty. You start to lose it if you don't make use of it. So I went to the very beginning, and started learning like a novice, or like a child would.

Pretty soon my wife and I were sitting together, and I'm learning from the software, and she's learning from me, and we're learning together. We laugh at the particularities of the language and our own attempts to imitate it. I laughed out loud at the sentence we made by mistake, here in translation,

The Apples is Blue.

You don't naturally know a language. You learn it. You might learn it slower or faster, with more or less aptitude, but the words and the forms and the structure—they all come to your ears and impress themselves on your mind. You learn them by heart. You repeat them and reinforce them by the use of them. I actually think you can develop a **Sprachgefühl**— you start to get a feel for the language!

The same lesson holds for matters of faith. There's a reason the Apostle tells us to hold fast the form of sound words, 2 Timothy 1:3. That's not just a safeguard against innovation—that's a divine calling to God's Words: to hear them, read, mark, learn, and take them to heart, as the familiar prayer says.

The Bible says that salvation is by faith. It says: faith cometh by hearing. As you hear the words, repeat them, think about them, and make use of them in prayer, you become more and more proficient. You get a feel for the language of faith! So it says: Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly.

Yet since we are all students of Jesus and learners of His Word, we will learn together from Him. Questions are welcome! There's no reason to blush if it takes time to learn (and learn again) the language of faith. We have every encouragement for this very thing:

What does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (Romans 10:8-9.)
